



# Conditions for admittance

## Students outside the EU

### Van Hall Larenstein Bachelor programmes, academic year 2009-2010

#### Application

Besides the application form, the following documents are required:

- certified copies of diplomas and transcripts;
- a certificate of proficiency in the English language (e.g. IELTS or TOEFL) if English is not your native language;
- a copy of your passport;
- two passport-sized photos;
- copy of your birth certificate
- certification and translation of documents is required when documents are not written in one of the following languages: Dutch, English, French, Spanish or German.

Based on this information, Van Hall Larenstein will take a decision:

- You are not suited to enter the programme: we will send you a letter to inform you about this and the reason why you were not admitted, or
- You are conditionally admitted.

#### Conditional Admittance

You will receive an official letter stating that you are conditionally admitted and that this becomes final when Van Hall Larenstein receives the down payment.

Steps:

1. The deposit of Euro 11,200 should be at the Van Hall Larenstein bank account not later than May 1, 2008. We request you to pay 11,200 Euro in order to facilitate your visa procedure. When we receive this payment in time, your admission becomes final and we will send you a letter to confirm this.
2. Van Hall Larenstein will start the visa procedure.
3. The Netherlands' Embassy or consulate in your country will contact you on the outcome of the visaprocedure.

4. You have to go with your passport and birth certificate to the Dutch Embassy/Consulate in your country where the visa will be issued.
5. You can arrange your trip to the Netherlands and should arrive between August 10 - 13, 2009. If you have definite travel data, please inform us.

#### The deposit

Van Hall Larenstein will use the deposit to cover the following items:

• Tuition fee 2009-10 <sup>1)</sup>	Euro	8,700
• Health insurance 2009-10	Euro	500
• Visa costs 2009-10	Euro	450
• Returned to you	Euro	1,550

Make sure you pay the deposit of 11,200 euro to the Van Hall Larenstein bank account before 1st May 2009.

Be Aware that you need about 400-600 euro<sup>1)</sup> per month for personal expenses, so bring sufficient money with you to cover those costs.

<sup>1)</sup> Please take note: Costs for board and lodging while studying at Wageningen or Velp are just estimates. If part of the study is realised in another country, costs for study, room and food may be higher. Tuition fee has been established at Euro 8.700. The tuition fee can be subject to a yearly increment. Van Hall Larenstein cannot be held responsible for any changes in prices.

## Housing

Van Hall Larenstein will arrange a room for you with Idealis, Student Housing Wageningen. Rent starts at the 1st or 15th of every month. Please note that Van Hall Larenstein is only facilitating. You will have a rent agreement with Idealis. Before taking your room you will have to pay a fee of €80. The fee will cover cleaning after you leave the room and includes a set of bedlinen.

## Introduction

Before the start of the academic year Van Hall Larenstein will organise an introduction week.

Van Hall Larenstein does not accept any responsibility for such risks as loss of property, accidents, illnesses, etc. We will assist all participants to acquire insurance cover for these risks. Insurance fees for students up to 41 years of age amount to approximately Euro 500 per year. Health and liability insurances are compulsory for all students and will be concluded by Van Hall Larenstein.

## Visa & temporary residence permit

Van Hall Larenstein will apply for a study visa. To enable us to do so we need the fully documented application. The procedure for obtaining a temporary residence permit will be started upon entering the Netherlands. To complete these procedures, students must bring a copy of their birth certificate (and their marriage certificate if married). Both documents need to be legalised by the Dutch Embassy and by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. The student needs to bring two passport-sized photographs as well.
